"Art is the tangible symbol of the spirit of a country" (Margaret Preston 1927). Central to Margaret Preston's distinctive Australian style were Chinese and Japanese influences along with the techniques and motifs of Australian Aboriginal art. From the 1920s through to her death in 1963 – a period when Aboriginal art received little public attention – Margaret Preston became one its most committed advocates. Over the last 20 years the National Gallery of Australia has assembled an extraordinary collection of etchings, woodcuts, masonite cuts, monotypes and stencils by the Australian artist Margaret Preston (1875–1963). Of all Australian artists, Preston is one of the most widely known, her vibrant decorative paintings and prints of distinctively Australian subjects (flowers, birds, animals and landscapes) have delighted the Australian public since they were first exhibited in the early 1920s.

Clearly, Margaret Preston was not entirely free of a certain cultural imperialism. (2) Indigenous artists have used European techniques and materials since 1926, on the mission station Hermannsburg, 130 km west of Alice Springs. Noteworthy here is the first Indigenous artist to become famous across all Australia: Albert Namatjira (1902-1959).

During her travels she visited many places and sought out the Indigenous art of other cultures, yet it was the Indigenous art of Australia that inspired her most. Preston travelled extensively throughout remote areas of Australia to see Indigenous paintings and carvings.

Margaret Preston (1875-1963) returned to Australia from Europe in 1919 determined to develop a modern and distinctly national art. Indigenous art was integral to her campaign and, after 1932, when she moved to Berowra in the Hawkesbury Basin near Sydney and encountered local rock art, she embraced its restricted palette and geometric forms.
